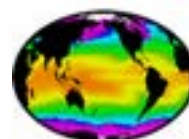

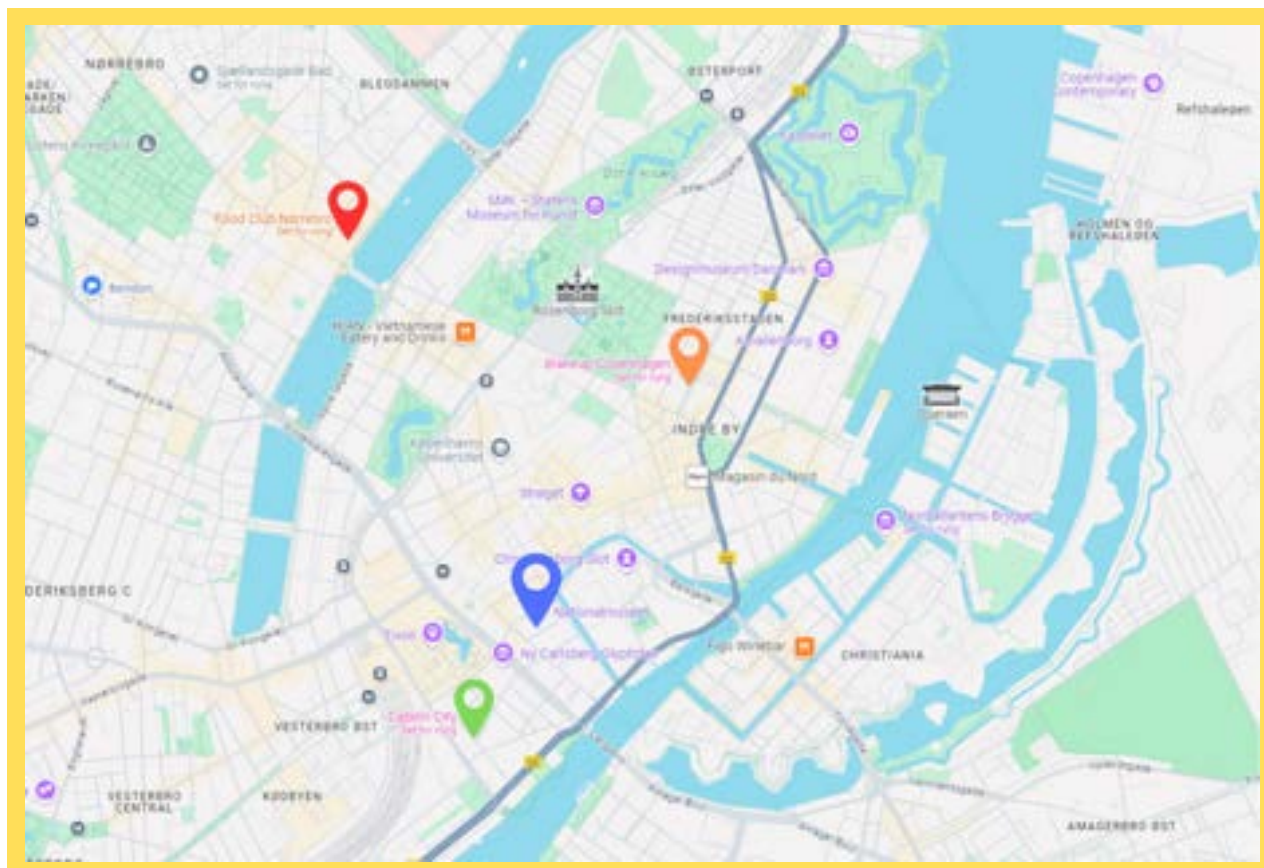

## Venue

The meeting will take place at **the National Museum of Denmark** in Copenhagen (blue pin on the map below).

**Address:** Ny Vestergade 10, 1471 København K, Danmark



Map of Copenhagen Center. **The blue pin** is the GHRSSST26 venue (The National Museum of Denmark). **The green and orange pins** are the recommended accommodations (CABINN city and Wakeup Copenhagen). **The red pin** is the restaurant Food Club Nørrebro, where we will be having dinner on Wednesday the 18th of June.

## How to get there

- **By metro:** The venue is within 10 minutes walking distance from both the 'Rådhuspladsen' and 'Gammel Strand' metro stations.
- **By train:** The venue is within 15 minutes walking distance from the Copenhagen Central Station (København H).
- **By bus:** For the shortest walking distance to the venue take bus 2A, 23, 26, 31 or 37 to the bus stop 'Stormbroen, Nationalmuseet'.
- **By bike:** The venue is easily reached by bike.

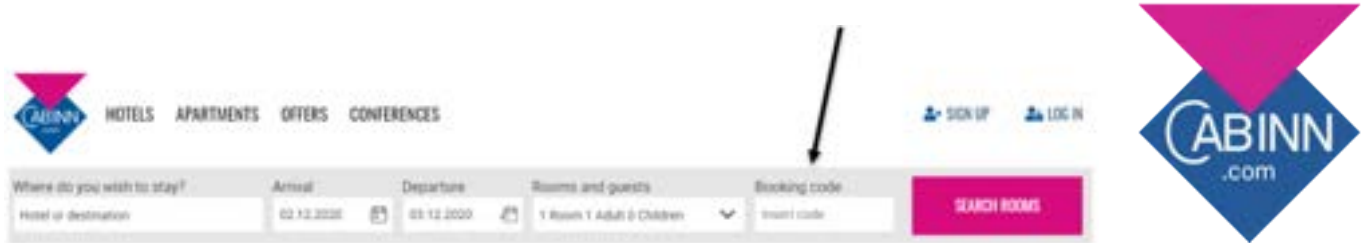

## Accommodation recommendations

### CABINN

We have arranged with CABINN that you can book a room at a reduced rate by using our unique booking code: **BLKGHRSSST**. CABINN City is located close to the GHRSSST26 venue (10-15 minutes walk). 80 rooms are available for you at CABINN City, for booking and payment via their website: [www.cabinn.com](http://www.cabinn.com).

The rooms can be booked for both single and double use, and breakfast can be purchased as an add-on. On March 16, 2025, 50% of the unbooked rooms will be released. May 19, 2024, will be the last day and deadline for booking rooms with this code. After this date, the code will expire.



**How to book CABINN:** Just choose the specific hotel and enter your arrival and departure date. Now enter the number of guests and rooms. Then enter your booking code where it says, "Booking code". When you click "search rooms", you can see your rates as well as available rooms. Choose room type and packages (breakfast, parking etc.). Then fill out the guest information and choose payment method. Finally, you must accept our terms of condition and then click "Reserve". If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to ask. ## What to do in Copenhagen

**Ny Carlsberg Glyptotek** displays ancient and modern art in truly unique surroundings. Founded in 1897 by brewer Carl Jacobsen, the gallery is renowned for its marble sculptures, collections of ancient Egyptian, Greek, Etruscan and Roman art and the beautiful winter garden



**Kunsthall Charlottenborg** is one of the largest and most beautiful exhibition spaces for contemporary art in Northern Europe. Kunsthall Charlottenborg is centrally located at Kongens Nytorv and is part of the The Royal Danish Academy of Art, Schools of Visual Art.

**The Botanical Garden** is Denmark's largest collection of living plants, a few steps from Nørreport Station. It's a free public green space to roam and relax in filled with rare trees, shrubs and herbs. The Botanical Garden holds ten hectares of gardens with a butterfly house and a tropical palm house dating to 1874.



**Assistens Churchyard:** Burial ground, green oasis, cultural treasure. Denmark's best known cemetery, Assistens Churchyard, is the final resting place of many famous Danes, like Hans Christian Andersen and Søren Kierkegaard. It's also a fun place to visit, take a stroll, cycle, run or just have a picnic, as Nørrebro's primary green space.

**Christiania** is the famous freetown of Copenhagen. The area was founded in 1971 and is independent of Danish government laws and regulations. Christiania is filled with beautiful self made homes, ecological restaurants, galleries and workshops.



## Bus, Metro and Train in Copenhagen

### Planning your journey

**Google Maps** works perfectly well for planning your journey. You can also use the **DOT Tickets app** or **Rejseplanen app**.

### Buying tickets

The easiest way to purchase tickets is through the Rejsekort or DOT tickets app.

- **Rejsekort app**: This app allows you to simply check in before entering the bus, metro or train and check out when your journey is over.
- **DOT Tickets app**: This app also allows you to both plan your journey and purchase your ticket.
- **Ticket machines**: You can also purchase tickets at the machines at train and metro stations, and at the airport. These tickets can be more expensive.
- **City Pass**: If you are planning to use public transportation a lot during your stay, it might make sense to buy a City Pass (small) which allows you to travel freely in Copenhagen (including airport).
  - City Passes can be bought on the app “DOT Tickets app” or from the ticket machines at train and metro stations.



### Travelling to and from the Airport

The metro takes you from the airport to the city center in 12 minutes. The metro station is located in direct extension of Terminal 3. It runs every 4–6 minute during the day and at 15–20 minute intervals at night.

- Tickets can be purchased through the apps stated above.
- Ticket can also be bought at ticket machines at the station and at DSB's ticket office in Terminal 3. Please note, the ticket machines do not accept notes, only coins and credit cards such as Dankort, VISA, etc.

## Renting a bike

Copenhagen is the most bicycle-friendly city in the world. Copenhageners own more than 745.000 bicycles, which is five times more than cars. You can get the local experience by renting a bike to get around - everything is within biking distance. You can rent a bike through:

- **Your accommodation** probably offer bike rental. Both CABINN Copenhagen and Wakeup Copenhagen offer relatively cheap bike rental.
- **Donkey republic** offers access to the largest fleet of rental pedal and E-bikes in Copenhagen. Just install the app and find a bike near you.



Before you do head out cycling in Copenhagen, it's a good idea to know the rules and etiquette. **Watch this short video** on what to do and what not to do on bike.
